The name “eri” is derived from the Assamese word “era”, which means “castor”, as the silkworm feeds on castor plants.

Unlike conventional silk production which involves killing silkworms by boiling pupae inside the cocoons, Eri silk is produced by harvesting the cocoons after the moth has abandoned the cocoon. For this reason, Eri silk is referred to as “Ahimsa” silk, peace silk or vegan silk.

A strong and durable fabric, Eri silk is irresistibly soft, with a tendency to get

softer with every use. It has a unique texture combining the elegance of silk with the comfort of cotton and warmth of wool. It is skin-friendly, isothermal, antifungal and biodegradable, making it a transeasonal fabric even for the most delicate skins.
